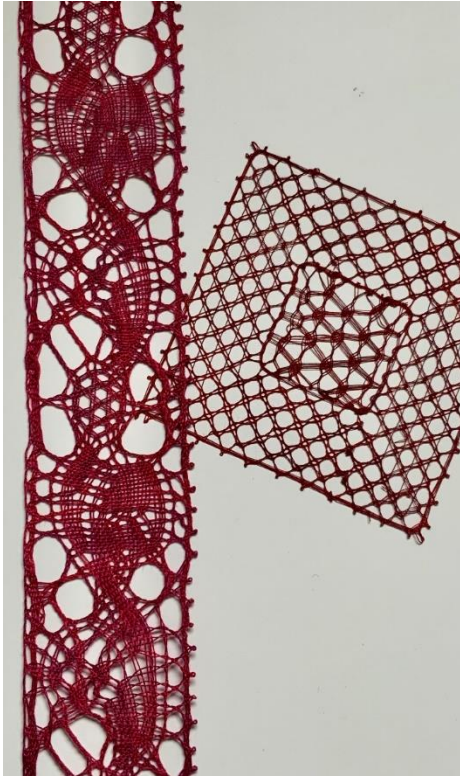


# AGM weekend —3 Day Class

## Binche with Vicki Taylor from NSW Australia

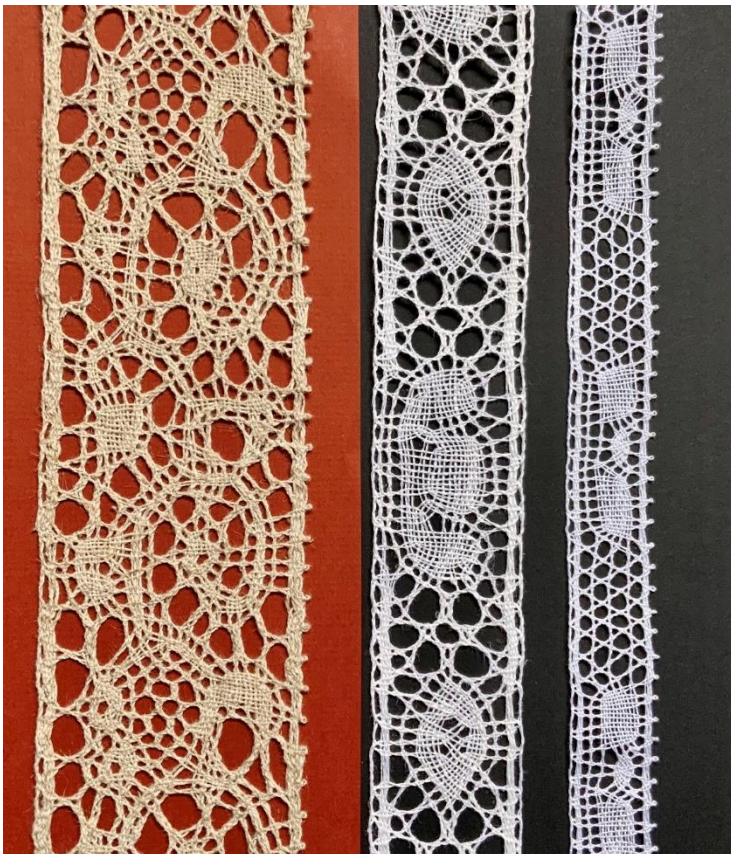
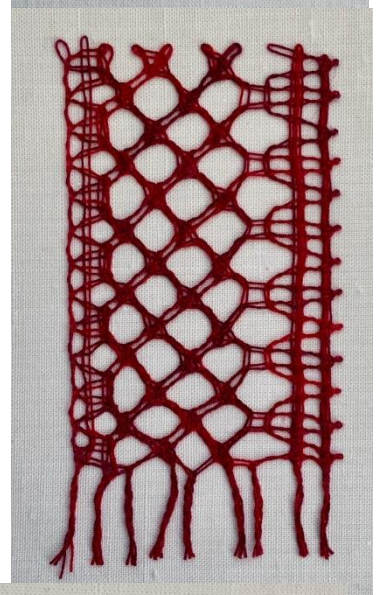
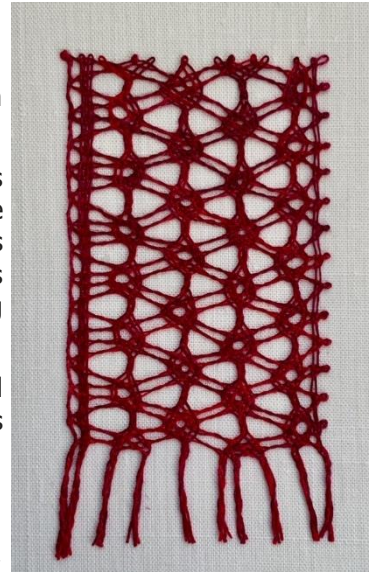
Binche is a lace made up of areas of solid motifs surrounded by open grounds. It also uses 4 pairs per pin instead of 2.



In preparation for the class Vicki has given us 3 prickings (right hand side photos) to practice using the 4 pairs and learning some of the grounds and how to follow working diagrams.

If you would like to do the class and would like a copy of the prickings please contact Tania Waghorn.

Vicki suggests you research the history of Binche laces, especially the 18th Century lace, so you know a little about the lace before beginning. This lace has few grounds whereas Modern Binche is different with more grounds and can be made at home. Nora Andries books on Antwerp Laces, Rosemary Shepard's Early Lace book and Binche Lace by Micheal Guisana. There will be copies of all these books in the class at the AGM.
